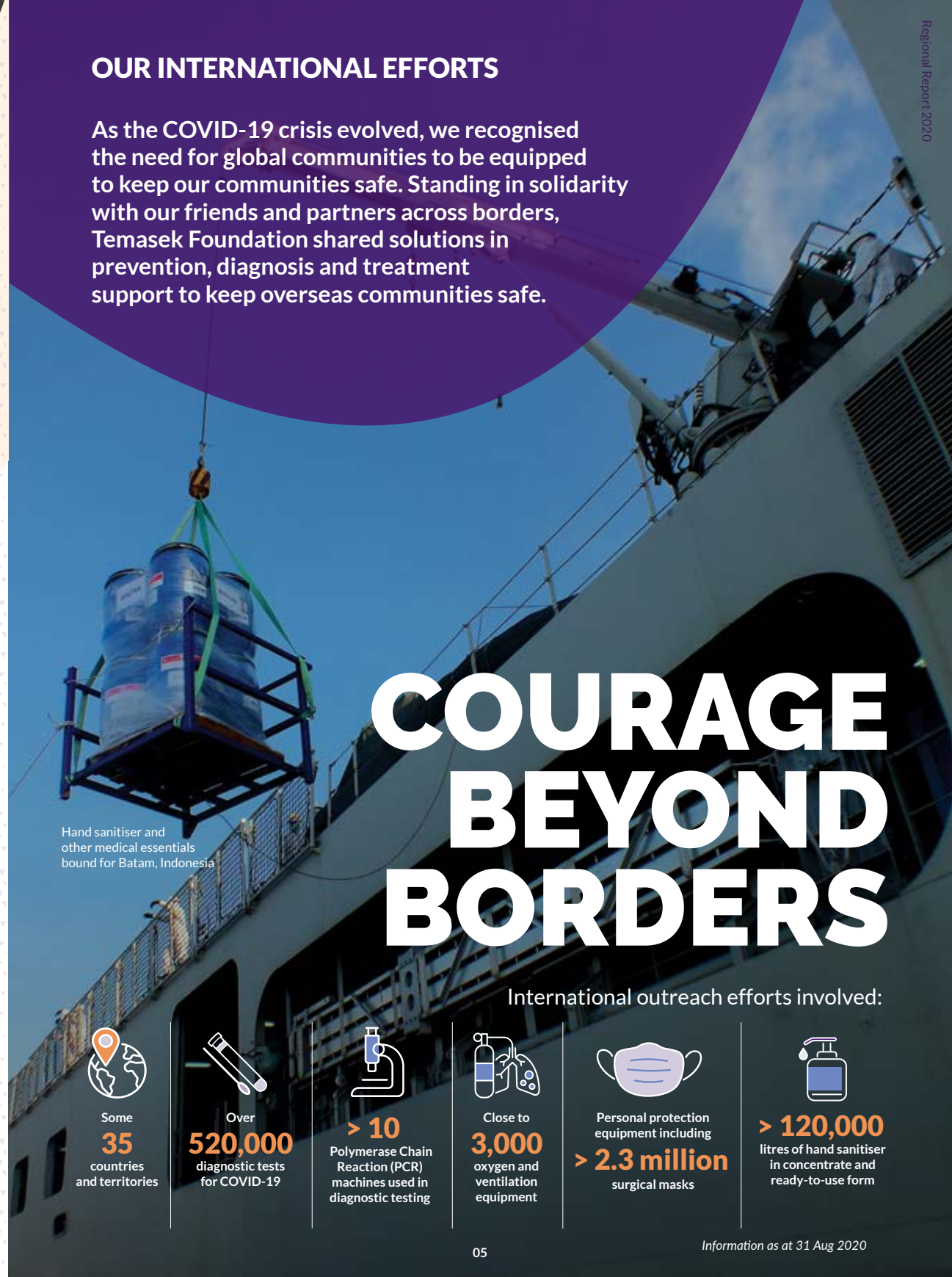

When COVID-19 arrived on our shores at the start of 2020, the invisible intruder posed a tangible threat to Singapore.

But we were unfazed. As a nation, we stood together and stepped up to the challenge.

The health crisis was a call to courage, and the community responded.

Facing the threat of the virus, individuals, families, and volunteers united as one.

Temasek Foundation supported programmes to safeguard communities in Singapore and globally.

These initiatives were made possible with the dedication and support of various partners who came alongside us.

FIGHTING COVID-19 BEYOND OUR BORDERS

We worked with partners across borders on a shared response to cope with the challenges of the pandemic.

With a common goal to keep our communities safe, Temasek Foundation partnered public and private sector organisations to deliver essential medical equipment and test kits to hospitals and medical facilities, while face masks and hand sanitiser were distributed to frontliners and the community.



In these difficult times, many communities are in urgent need of medical and other humanitarian resources.

Partnering **Singapore Airlines** and the **World Food Programme**, **Temasek Foundation** supported efforts to deliver life-saving supplies to communities in need, especially within Asia.

In 2019, the Summit brought together close to 400 international business leaders and prominent thinkers, and engaged on the theme of "Asia 2030" and topics surrounding the challenges and prospects facing the region in the next decade, among others.

As part of the Singapore Summit, the SSYSLP is an exclusive by-invitation-only programme designed for young leaders, aged 40 and under, who are doing significant work of making societies better for all.

From 18 to 21 September 2019, 18 participants from across Asia and beyond gathered in Singapore to share their perspectives, passion and purpose. They engaged in multigenerational conversations and gleaned diverse perspectives from each other and from established leaders.

The Asia Journalism Fellowship is an annual platform for mid-career journalists from the region to engage in professional and cultural exchange through workshops, discussions and dialogues.

The programme brings together seasoned journalists from varied backgrounds and working in widely differing circumstances to live, learn and work together in Singapore for three months each year.

The 10th run of the programme, held from July to October 2019, saw 16 journalists from across Asia, including the first fellow from Kazakhstan, participate in the programme and individual research projects to sharpen their professional skills and understanding of trends in media, communication and Asia.

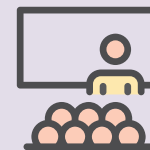

The STEP Environment Camp 2019 was a six-day programme for youths from Singapore and Asia. Organised from 10 to 16 November 2019, 92 youths participated in lectures, hands-on workshops, field trips and student presentations.

Built around the overarching theme of Climate Change and Sustainability, the programme nurtured young scientists in Asia, with an emphasis on environmental stewardship.

First Responders Safety & Performance Symposium 2019
